Homework

In Year 5 children are expected to spend 2 hours a week on homework tasks consisting of 30 minutes Maths and 30 minutes English/Spellings every week. English and Maths homework will be given out on a Friday with Maths handed in on a Tuesday and Literacy on a Wednesday. The other hour of homework should be made up by reading 10-15 minutes 5 times a week. Home reading should be recorded in children's reading records and signed. Reading records will be expected in on a Monday. In addition, once a fortnight children will be given a 'talk homework'. This will be a topic to briefly discuss at home in preparation for a writing task the following day. We welcome your support in ensuring that homework is completed and handed in at the appropriate time.
